Skip Moorehouse easily won the Atlantic Coasts Championships at the Miles River Yacht Club in St. Michaels, Md. on Sept. 25th and 26th.

There were 23 entries from Regions II and III, but none from Region I.

Three races were sailed on Saturday in a 10-15 MPH breeze under sunny skies. It was perfect Penguin weather.

Sunday was a different story; light air and light rain. Only one race was held before the wind died completely.

A large delegation of South American Sailors participated and dominated the Junior Series which were run early in the week. Twenty-seven boats participated with Alex Welter of Sao Paulo, Brasil finishing first followed by Martin Costa of Buenos Aires and Jorge Bercht, the defending International Junior Champ, finishing third. Costa led after the first three races but a starting line fracture in the fourth race severely hurt his chances.

On Wednesday afternoon a fleet of 52 Seniors and some top Juniors crossed the starting line in northwest winds with puffs up to 25. Cliff Campbell, former International Champion, and Phil Marriner won the first days races.

Thursday morning featured a light southwesterly wind blowing at approximately 7 knots. Mel Reid won that race and moved solidly into the lead. The winds continued to freshen during the fourth race and Jose Agonida of Brasil was the winner. Reid suffered a near disaster at the jibing mark as two boats forced an overlap and caused him to drop to 17th place.
