MINUTES OF THE 1975 ANNUAL MEETING OF I.P.C.D.A. - Chicago

The meeting was called to order at the Columbia Y.C. on July 17, 1975, at 5:00 PM by President Dick Mayne and the roll call of fleets was taken.

The Treasurer's report indicated a balance on hand of \$88.73 and was accepted.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with by mutual consent of those present.

The Measurement Committee report indicated that as of July 1, 1975, certificates were issued for 33 wood boats and 5 fiber glass boats; in addition 5 boats were not approved. To date 5049 Penguins have been approved and 2000 not approved. The latest number issued was 9500 to 9519 which went to South America. (The discrepancy in total is due to boats that were issued numbers but not built or measured.)

The Technical Committee reported that during the last year, 27 sets of standard plans and 7 sets of self-rescue plans were sold for an income of \$291.00, bringing that total account to \$428.00, part of which will be transferred to the IPCDA Savings Account. In answer to questions, the aluminum mast development remains the same as last year.

Under OLD BUSINESS - a request was made for some type of promotional brochure and a directory or handbook.

The first item of NEW BUSINESS was a bid by the Argentine delegation to host the 1976 International Championship at Olivos, starting January 26. The item was referred to the Executive Committee. (The bid has since been accepted)

Bids were requested for the location of a National Championship, but none offered.

The following items were discussed, but since they would require By-Law changes, they were all referred to the Executive Committee for further study and action:

- 1) Bill Richards requested elimination of the oars

and oar lock requirement from the Penguin measurement requirements. (Note: The Technical Committee was negative in regard to this suggestion.)

2) Bill Richards requested publishing of all tolerances for the Penguin plans to insure accurate measurement. A strong pro and con discussion followed.

3) A motion was made by Tom Provencher, and seconded, that, "To recognize contributions and encourage attendance at International Regattas, the current Executive Committee and five previous Champions be invited to the International Championship Regattas." The motion was passed, but ruled out of order since it required a By-Law change.

4) James Byrne recommended that for legal reasons, the Association should consider Incorporation.

Since there was no additional New Business, the report of the Nominating Committee was read as follows: President - Dick Mayne, Vice President - Steve Sprole, Secretary - Bill Holmes, Treasurer - James Byrne, Delegate At Large - Argentina - Mario J. Costa, Brazil - Ellen D.K. Alberti.

The Meeting was closed at 6:20.
